He advised that he hoped the new committee can overcome the lack of support from the members for club activities and he is hopeful the new committee after the AGM will be able to overcome this moving forward. Grumpy's Shed total sales for the Conference show was \$413.45 plus and order for \$42.00.

BATEMANS BAY ORCHID & FOLIAGE SOCIETY Treasurers' Report for financial year ending 30/09/2015

I am pleased to present the Treasurers' report for the financial year ending 30 September 2015. For the Club's, as well as the Executive committee and ordinary committee member's protection, the books have been audited by a Chartered Accountant.

The Clubs Community Solutions cheque account had an opening balance of \$8008.20 on 1st October 2014 and a closing balance of \$15378.66 on 30 September 2015. We had a total income for the year of \$22632.82 and expenditure of \$15274.99. This indicates that we made a profit for the year of \$7370.46.

Club membership remained fairly constant during the year, although we did welcome a number of new members. We currently have 60 members although there are a number of these who are inactive but retain their membership.

The club ran three (3) shows during the year. Each show included a publicity day at the Village Centre prior to the Show. Monies raised at these activities are included in Show takings for this

year. The Native Show in October 2014 was run at a loss due to the number of plants purchased from Neville Roper; the Winter Show in July 2015 had a profit of \$704.00 and the Spring Show realised a profit of \$690.35.

Apart from the Shows, our main sources of income were from the club meeting Raffles, Grumpy's Shed and the Bunning's BBQs. The monthly raffles returned us \$1197.80 which was a little below last year. Thanks to those who provided the articles for the raffle prizes and to Batehaven Garden & Hardware for the monthly lucky door prize.

Our two (2) auctions for the year – the AGM (November) raised \$186.10 and the mini auction in May raised 354.65 - a total of \$540.75 which was also down on last year.

Our expenditure to keep Grumpy's Shed stocked for the year was \$7444.74 which returned \$10,697.30 a profit of \$3252.56.

Bunning's BBQs has been a lot more successful since moving to the new site. Costs for the year were \$1838.88 which returned to us \$4931.50; a profit of \$3092.62

Our main expenditure - apart of those already noted, related to office supplies – ink, paper, tape, stamps etc of \$804.30 which is about a half of last year's; plant purchases for raffle table of \$1097.00. This figure excludes plants purchased for the Spring Show as they have been included in the reconciliation for that show.

The reconciliation for the Regional Show and Conference is available, but not included in this summary as it falls in the next financial year.

The displays were exceptional with some interesting interpretations of the theme and Canberra was worthy winners of the displays.

There were some 450 people through the door along with 35 registrations which indicates the show was well received.

Speakers also were well received and the Vendors left happy with their sales.

2 Judging panels worked hard to complete the judging with judging finished at 11.30pm it is of note that it was commented our conference was the biggest with plant numbers on some of the past conferences and it has been agreed that all conferences in future will have 3 judging panels The Club panel has now welcomed Milton Ulladulla into the fold and we look forward to their participation in future conferences and shows.

Next Conference in 2017 is in Albury Wodonga & 2019 back to the coast with Eurobodalla club I thank all the members who helped with the show from meeting people at the front door to answering the many questions from the public, raffle sale, plant sales etc, Grumpys shed for participating and last but not least the show committee for having the vision to deliver this show and conference to the success that it was.
