# South and West Region Judging Panel Orchid Appreciation / Judging Classes

A number of our members as well as those from both Milton/Ulladulla and Eurobodalla participated in the introductory session of The Orchid Society of NSW Orchid appreciation/judging course.

The course is aimed at orchid growers of all levels of experience who want to learn more about the various genera and what makes an awardable quality orchid or quality display through the eyes of judges.

The course is also recommended for Show Marshals who want to learn and understand show schedules and in which classes their plants should be exhibited.

It is intended that course will be run every second month on one weekend. It is anticipated that the course will run for approximately 2 years.

Participants will gain experience by completing assignments set during the course to reinforce their understanding of the topics.

The cost for the course will be a one off fee of \$50.00 to cover handouts and hire of the venue. #### 2. TREASURER'S REPORT:

#### 3. GENERAL BUSINESS:

- **a.** Next General Meeting: No decisions were made regarding the next general meeting.
- **b.** Membership Committee nominations were called for to fill the vacancy on the committee management. Dorothy Kauffman was nominated by Brian Coulton. The nomination was accepted by Dorothy seconded and then by Sylvia Hawkins. There were no further nominations. membership The accepted this nomination.
- c. Restock Grumpy's Shed Grumpy's is in need of pots, perlite and bark. Total cost will be about \$4,000. After some discussion regarding pots and bark and where this would be purchased from this purchase was

agreed. Any increase above this figure would be discussed at the next committee prior to the purchase being approved.

Moved Dorothy Kauffmann; seconded Sylvia Hawkins. Carried.

- d. Gift Vouchers as stated in the newsletter, there are now two lucky badge draw gift vouchers available each meeting – one from Batehaven Nursery & Hardware and the other from Mogo Orchid & Fern Nursery. The club thanks both these sponsors.
- **e.** President reminded members of the workshop to be held at his place on Saturday 12<sup>th</sup> March at 1pm.
- f. Ron asked who had the stock of BBQ aprons. Secretary has same and will take some to presidents' place prior to Friday's BBQ. More assistance is required for this day. Members nominated themselves from the floor. Another day is Friday 8<sup>th</sup> April. Assistance offered by members.
- g. It was discussed at the committee meeting that a Facebook page be setup. Anne Marie has offered to do this. After some discussion, Anne-Marie moved that a Facebook page be set up. Seconded by Brian Coulton. Carried. Margaret and Anne-Marie will also put the newsletter together and with Diane Hay's assistance mange the web page.
- drinks stock. With h. BBQ the changeover of president, BBQ stock also moved. It was found with this move that there were a number of soft drink cans out of date. These have discarded and the supply been restocked, which was part of the reason for the expenditure for the BBQ last month. New eskies and BBQ tools also needed to be purchased.
- i. Also at the committee meeting, an "orchid crawl" was suggested. There was some discussion relating to which members would host this event, the

- order of those visits and when it would occur. It was settled that it would be mid-late May and visit Ron Boyd's (1<sup>st</sup>), Brian Coulton (2<sup>nd</sup>) and Tony Groube's & Liz Cleaver's last where there would be refreshments. Date to be finalized at April meeting.
- j. At the AGM in November, the members were informed that the current auditor would no longer be able to audit the clubs' accounts due to ill-health. The members were asked if they knew of anyone who would be able to do this for the club. No names were forthcoming. After some discussion, it was agreed that the Treasurer and the Secretary would try to source an auditor.
- k. Plants for Raffle table: Ron had purchased some plants for this month. A number of members had also brought raffle items in. Thank you to those members. A discussion was held as to where some plants and the costs could be purchased. In the end it was agreed by a show of hands that 50mm pots would be purchased from Stebbing's for \$4.50 each enough to do the general meeting for the year. More will need to be purchased for the Christmas party benching results.
- I. Show Marshall: Rob Pollack is unsure of his work commitments for this year, so was reluctant to agree to take on this role again. Mitch Karnaghan has also been approached but is also unsure of his availability for the year. After some further discussion, Ron put himself forward as an option to fill this role with Mitch's assistance. Brian Coulton offered to be an assistant in a learning capacity. Benching was also discussed. Tonv with assistance will do the benching results at club meetings. Secretary Margaret will record points score electronically. These suggestions were accepted by show of hands.

- m. At the committee meeting there had been a discussion regarding the making and selling of posies at the Village Centre and the Shows. Discussion had centred around the purchase of spikes for flowers for these. It had also been suggested that the club purchase some plants that members "look after" which would just be used for flowers. This sparked an extensive discussion relating to the pros and cons of each suggestion. However, it is not just the spikes that are required, it is also greenery, members to make them and a place to make them. Rob & Sue indicated that they did not want the club to continue to use their garage and they were thanked for having provided that venue for the last 3 years. In the end, Leanda agreed to speak with members to seek assistance with them. Dorothy making offered Grumpy's Shed as a venue and Ron agreed to seek the availability of spikes to purchase.
- **n.** Bus Trip in discussion with members outside the meetings, Ron had agreed that a bus trip to Sydney was probably a prohibitive cost. However, other options discussed. These were included going to Canberra to their Orchid show and to visit the Herborium. Ron also has been informed that the local Sea Hawks football club has a 19 seat bus which is available for hire by donating \$100 to that club and returning it with a full tank of fuel. Currently we are unaware if there maybe restrictions on its use. Another option was in conjunction with Eurobodalla and Milton/Ulladulla look at hiring a 40 seat bus and go up to Cronulla on 10<sup>th</sup> October. The bus would need to have all seats occupied before it would be cost effective. For further discussion.

- o. At the committee, Ron had requested that the champion prize for each class of cymbidium be reinstated for the Winter and Spring shows. These classes had remained on the show schedule but there was only one champion from across all the size ranges. After some discussion, Tony Groube suggested that a small subcommittee be formed to review the show schedule in its entirety. This was seconded by Rob Fish and carried by show of hands. The subcommittee will be Tony Groube, Liz Cleaver, Rob Fish, Sylvia Hawkins, Ron Boyd and Margaret Turner as minute taker. Date to be decided at next meeting.
- p. Charitable donations: Rob Fish put forward the suggestion that the club donate a \$1000 to both the Batemans Hospital and the Westpac Rescue Helicopter. Brian Perkins put forward the comment that if we donated to BB hospital a similar amount should go to Moruya Hospital. An option to make a donation of \$500 each to two organisations had been discussed at committee as well. Secretary is following up on the following suggestions: - Soldier on; Black Dog Institute; BB Hospital; Oncology Unit at Moruya Hospital; Sailability and in some way help with the homeless of Batemans Bay. The membership were requested to let the Secretary know of any suggestions. This is to be placed in the newsletter separately from the minutes. No other suggestions were forth coming from the floor at this time.
- q. Club computer the purchase of a computer had been discussed at some length last year and it was again proposed by Brian Coulton and seconded by Dorothy Kauffman. It was felt that the club needed to have a copy of "Orchid Wiz" and to

purchase a copy of "Orchids Plus" when it becomes available. These software programs would total about \$400 annually. Tony said the EOC had just purchased a new laptop for about \$500. The Secretary will investigate some options and bring them back to the next meeting.

#### Coffee Break 9pm Returned 9.15pm

After the coffee break, Ron spoke about how he "on grows" his orchids from flasks and small pots to larger pots. He spoke about the growing conditions, watering and potting mix used. He showed the membership some plants that he had "on grown" that varied from a few months to several years. Brian Coulton then spoke about his experience with "on growing". Brian stated that he did not buy orchids in flasks but purchased them already removed from the flasks with the agar removed and ready for putting into pots. Brian brought in a tray that he had purchased and potted in November. A number of questions were regarding water, fertilizer and placement of trays with the pots. Apparently, if one goes onto eBay and types in "orchid flasks" one gets a variety of options but if unsure it is best to discuss with members who do this ie. Ron and Brian.
