In Your Orchid House

As I had the opportunity at the Show of speaking to many of our more experienced growers, I asked them what they would be doing in their shade clothed orchid houses at this time. Here are some of their comments.

Checking for spikes on natives. It may well be too early for sarcs but with this crazy growing season, that we have had it is worth looking occasionally.

Continue to check for fungus, scale and grubs especially under leaves of soft canes. For the grubs, sometimes it is best to do that with a torch at night when they are more likely to be active.

General Maintaince of your orchids and there surrounds. Things like weeding, making sure potting mix drains, general condition of your plants. While looking at your plants, check tags to make sure they are legible and rewrite if not. Don't forget also to check the condition of your shade house including the roof. If you have a hole in the roof, when the cover is removed and the sun shines through, a plant may be burnt.

I asked about repotting and the response from the group was unanimous, if potting on this can be done all year round, however if dividing plants this should only be done between September and December.

I was also reminded that although we talk about the reduced need for water over the winter months with all the wind we have been experiencing, the plants are likely to dry out more quickly so check regularly and water as required.

2. TREASURER'S REPORT:

Treasurer Leanda presented:- Opening balance \$29,390.94; Income \$1.255.49; Expenditure \$999.75

Unpresented cheques \$259.24; Closing balance \$29,649.68. Bunnings vouchers to the value of \$225.00. Members are reminded that the charitable donations from the March Workshop are still to be distributed. This will be done at the closing of the Winter Show.

3. Guest Speaker – Mitch Karnaghan

Mitch spoke about the need to find another way of mounting native orchid species, as growers are no longer able to use natural/native timbers to do this because of the changes to the Native Plant Legislation several years ago. Mitch stated that he had been trying out different ways of mounting plants. Most genre of orchids will grow on mounts; just check what their growing habits are.

Mitch demonstrated the making of his mounts using 100 – 200mm plumbing pipe. All requirements for these mounts can be purchased through Bunnings. He buys the pipe in meter lengths and cuts them in half.

He starts by making small holes on each side at top and bottom to be used for hanging. He then drills evenly spaced larger holes down the length of the pipe, which allows for airflow and drainage. Over one side of the pipe, he places a velvet type weed mat, which is then covered by tree mat with fluffy side up. The whole pipe is then covered by 50% shade cloth. Once the outside of the pot is complete, a pot is placed in one end. The inside is filled with beanbags beans and another pot completes the seal of the pipe.

When fixing plants to the pipe/mount, use bush moss or coconut fibre depending on plants chosen. Mitch uses 30lb fishing line to secure the plants to the mount. When deciding which plants to mount, always check growing habits to ensure the mount is displayed correctly – on its side or upright.

Mitch stated that he had several judges' comment favourably on the mounts. Multiple genre or a single genre can be displayed on the mount providing all plants are correctly labelled. Be careful that these mounts are not over watered.

- g. Anne-Marie raised the issue of the falling interest rates with the current bank balance. She had spoken with Westpac where we currently have our account and they offered an interest rate of 2% for a fixed term. We currently receive 0.01% on the working account.
