DRAFT MINUTES OF THE GENERAL MEETING HELD SOLDIERS CLUB; BEACH ROAD BATEMANS BAY

Monday 4th July 2017

PRESENT: Members: 21 Apologies:

6 Visitors: 2

President Ron opened the meeting thanking all for coming.

Ron then welcomed Peter Stubbs, a local orchid grower and Registrar of the South-West Judging Panel. Peter spoke about presenting orchids for the show bench as well as saying these guidelines should be used when putting plants on the meeting night benching.

Peter stated that planning to show plants should begin early.

- Put plants with spikes in a protective position with good light to help flowers develop.
 Control pests and water according to the plants' needs.
- When staking, the stake should not protrude above the flower spike. It should be about 10 – 15mm above the last tie, which should be below the first flower. Do not use cable ties or tape on stakes/spikes – the judges may want to unstake the flower to note how strong the stem is – should support the flowers unaided. Remember not all orchids need staking.
- Clean up the pot if does not come clean, place in a second pot that is clean (looks better).
- Clean the leaves but avoid excessive oiling.
- Water plants well in advance of the show – stops damaging the display table covering.
- Remove weeds
- Trim damaged leaves into natural shape of plant leaf.
- Plant name label should be clear and easy to read
- Plants should be disease and pest free.
- Transporting plants to show/meeting – aim to arrive undamaged
- Can use temporary stakes but remove before placing on show bench.

Peter then walked along the display bench and discussed the staking habit of the plants on display, some were staked well and others not so well. He explained that you could use artificial means to make sure flowers are presented in the best possible way and explained some of those methods.

3. GENERAL BUSINESS:

- a. Next General Meeting Graeme Krake, speaking on Australian Native Terrestrial Orchids
- b. The updated copies of the Constitution were discussed. Changes were recommended and accepted. It was suggested that just the pages with changes be sent out with the next newsletter as there is not a large number. This was accepted.
- **c.** The updated By-Laws were then discussed. A number of changes

were suggested. The area that had the largest amount of discussion related to the section about the elevation of the Novice grower to the Open section. However, due to the lateness of the hour, it was decided to postpone any further discussion until next meeting. Tony agreed that he would send Ron & Margaret the wording from EOC By-Laws for this section.

- i. Anne-Marie is almost finished painting the banners in preparation for Ron to put up next week.
- j. Plant of the Night certificates were handed out.
