## In your orchid house:

Repotting, fertilizing and watering and watching for bugs seem to be the order of the day at present, particularly during such changeable weather.

There is a relatively new product available called Confidor pills or initiator tablets. It is a marble sized ball which offers a systemic plant fertilizer and insecticide. Suggested usage is one ball per 7 or 8 inch pot. It can be cut in half for smaller pots. Several of the commercial orchid nurseries are using it and claiming good insecticide control however please note that the manufacturers do not specifically recommend it for orchids. #### 2. TREASURER'S REPORT:

Treasurer Anne-Marie presented the monthly report. Opening balance was \$13,575.89. Income was \$2781.95 mainly from Grumpy's shed \$1377.95 and BBQ on 15<sup>th</sup> of \$525.05 and Native show \$751.80. Expenditure was \$1638.29 with most costs being associated with the Native Show. Unpresented cheques to the value of \$320.00. Bank balance is

\$14719.55 which will reduce to \$14399.55 once cheques have been presented.

## 3. GENERAL BUSINESS:

- a. Next General Meeting will be the Christmas luncheon at the Gardens Café at the Botanical Gardens on Wednesday 7<sup>th</sup> December at 11.30 for a brief meeting to commence at 12midday. Meeting with cover correspondence, monthly financial statement and any other outstanding issues.
- b. The treasurer then spoke to the cost of the luncheon. The discount given to members comes from monies raised at the BBQs which raise a lot of money for the club. Thank you to those willing workers who help at them. Anne-Marie then put the motion that "the club pays \$12.50 and members pay \$15.00 for Christmas lunch." This was seconded by Megan Quinlivan and passed on a show of hands.
- c. Ron queried about Plant of the Night outstanding certificates, were they with secretary's materials that treasurer had – no. Ron expressed his concerns and stated he would be doing the certificates next year if he was re-elected as President.

- **e.** Sue Fish pointed out that Margaret had said at the previous meeting that the outstanding Plant of the Night Certificates,

- would be handed out at the December meeting.
- f. Certificates in frames were handed out to the Grand Champion winners (Robert came forward to receive it) and the Champion Novice winner Brian Perkins.
- g. Certificate of Excellence given to Liz Cleaver & Tony Groube for flowering their Growing Experience plant – Pywacket 'Cornflakes' Cym. Australian Ginger 'Bronzy'
- h. Robert Fish queried if Ron had done the write up for the orchid magazine as Maria's name was incorrectly printed. Ron explained, he had sent correct information but they don't send to him before it's printed. Maria was present and was not upset, as her picture was in it and her name did appear.
- i. Newsletters were brought up and Dot and Lin both commented they still weren't getting them. Treasurer would speak to Secretary about this problem. Posted newsletters were suggested.

Meeting Opened 8.30pm.

Minutes of the February 2016 Special Meeting had been circulated with the notice of the AGM. Treasurer, in the Secretaries absence, asked if there were any changes to the minutes as presented. No comments or questions were forthcoming. Treasurer moved the motion that they be accepted as read, seconded by Leanda O'Connor.

Motion 2 some discussion

Proposed Ron Boyd Seconded Kate Willis, a vote was called for by A.M.Collins....

Result - for 12; against 2; carried by majority

The President vacated the chair and the Returning Officer Tony Groube took the chair. All positions were declared vacant.

The envelope with nominations for positions was opened by the Returning Officer.

Results are:

#### **PRESIDENTS REPORT 2016**

Welcome fellow members to our 2016 AGM.

For me, taking on the position as President way back in February this year, has resulted in a rather interesting time. First up, and most important to me and the club members, was to get a good group of guest speakers for the year. Starting out so late in the year made it difficult as most guest speakers were already booked. Most times you may need to book them a year in advance, however I had soon booked an impressive list of speakers.

First up in June was Lynne Phelan, who gave us an interesting talk on the Laelia Cattleya family and Lynne explained how easy this group was to grow and flower, followed by a delightful slide show of her plants.

My talk on Paphiopedilums at the July meeting seemed to inspire a few more growers to try this interesting group of orchids.

The August meeting saw Phil Grech talk on how the use of cow manure tea added beneficial microbes to his potting mix and in return he grows high quality orchids that win him many Champions. His power point show of what judges look for in selecting an orchid flower for a champion show orchid was very interesting.

The September meeting saw us enjoy a wonderful PowerPoint and great talk by David Gynn of Sequoia Orchids on his Native Cymbidium species, crossed back onto some of the modern intermediate and miniature Cymbidiums, to produce some amazing colours on easy to grow and flower pendulous Cymbidiums.

The Winter Show was a great success, and congratulations to Maria Kacarovski on her prize winning Grand-Champion Cymbidium Ruby Eyes "Royal Show". Also many thanks to all who supported the show bench with their orchids and a big thanks to the Novice Section. I have never seen this section so well supported.

The Spring Show was very successful due to the amount of flowering orchids brought in. We were down a lot on the cymbidiums but some of the growers had a few problems this year due to the crazy weather pattern, I certainly did, and it was still an impressive show due to the large numbers of natives. Congratulations to Tony Groube and Liz Cleaver for taking out Grand-Champion with Angraecum Veitchii as well as Best Specimen Orchid... well done.

Margaret Turner took out Champion Novice with Cymbidium unknown. Margaret also cleaned up the Novice Section in the Spring Show, taking Champion Novice and Most Successful Exhibitor in both shows and champion sarc and most successful novice at the Native show. Congratulations to all other winners, your effort and orchids certainly made the show.

I have had the show results published in the Bay Post and reports printed in the Orchids Australia Magazine. Both enhance our club members growing ability and promote our club's shows.

I usually do not like to single out helpers from the show as a they all do their fair share of work to make the show a huge success but I must single out Tony Groube for all the support and hard work he did to make my job as Show Marshal a lot easier and helped set up the orchids for such a great display for all the public to enjoy at all three shows this year.

I would like to say a big thank you to all my committee members, without your loyal support

the year would not have been as successful as it was.

The Bunning BBQ brought in a lot of money to cover some of the cost of running all 3 shows, prize money, ribbons, sashes, trophies, raffle prizes etc, I would like to thank all those who helped out during the year, it certainly made it all worthwhile
