President's Report

Welcome all members to our next club meeting Monday July 2nd.

At our July meeting, we will be discussing the NSW government's policy on growing Australian Native orchids that will affect all growers of Native orchids in NSW. There seems to be an opinion that everyone who grow Native orchids and sells any to the public at shows etc. will need to have a licence!! (see below)

"The NSW Government's Whole Plant Sustainable Management Plan 2018-22 commenced operation on 1st January 2018 and it contains important provisions that affect members of ANOS Groups and other orchid societies and individuals who grow and sell Australian native orchid species which are native to NSW."

Changes in legislation.

Due to changes to the Native Plant legislation, the committee made a decision that BBOFS would apply for a licence to sell native orchids both species and hybrids. After much discussion at the committee meeting, and talking to the Dept of Environment and Heritage, it is believed that the main points of the new legislation are as follows:

- a) It relates to buying, selling and propagation of native orchids;
- b) This applies if orchids are collected in the wild, propagated or purchased through a vendor.
- c) Selling between members at club meeting is ok under the legislation;
- d) If selling to the public a licence is required. Growers who wish to sell native orchids to the public should obtain a licence for themselves. Fines for not doing this and being caught are enormous.
- e) BBOFS needs to keep a database of members who have native orchids for anything identified in point (a)
- f) If native orchids are sold to the public at shows etc, a list of the genera of plants sold, if in spike or flower and the identification licence number of the seller if applicable, must be kept.
- g) All plants must have a tag that includes licence number and parents of plant, if known.
- h) Cost of licence is \$30 per year or \$100 for 5 years.

As a result of all these changes, BBOFS will not be able to sell native orchids at the Winter Show. (see President's report)

However, if members wish to sell their native orchids because of these changes, the sales table at club meetings can be used. If you wish to sell a number of plants, please use the plant lists for ease of ensuring sales monies are kept according to By-Laws. These will be available at meetings.

The bus trip is Friday 17th August. Bus pickup times are included at the end of the newsletter. As the cut off date for BBOFS members to nominate to go on this trip has passed, it is now open to other clubs. Please let Anne-Marie know if you wish to be on it.

2. TREASURER'S REPORT:

Treasurer Anne-Marie presented:Opening balance \$26,038.88; income \$656.23; expenditure \$167.48; no outstanding cheques & all monies deposited. Current balance \$26,527.63. Floats and vouchers remain the same.

3. GENERAL BUSINESS:

- a. Next General Meeting: Ron speaking about preparing your orchids for showing.
- b. Prior to the start of the meeting, Ron, Tony and Mitch were discussing the legislative changes to the Native Plant Legislation, which came into effect in January 2018. This will be discussed further at committee. Tony stated EOC had applied for a license.
- c. Bunnings BBQs contact made with Krystal regarding starting to do these again on a bi-monthly basis. She has finished the current program for next three months, so will look at including BBOFS again after August. Also explained that we could do more frequently if given plenty of notice minimum of five (5) days.
- d. Workshop in March 2019: 3 speakers now confirmed:- Ray Clements; David Gynn and Lloyd Edwards. Ray will speak about Phaphs and deflasking; David is from Sequoria Orchids – mini cymbids; Lloyd is from Earth to Joy Orchids.
- e. Ron then presented his talk on Phalaenopsis with a slide show of flowers. Main points were: medium bark potting mix; regular early in day watering – mister helps maintain requirements; they love humidity around 50 – 75%; fertilize as required – Ron recommended Campbell's fertilizer as has a good level of phosphate which can be purchased from Garden City Plastics. They do not like high

nitrogen levels in fertilizer. Flowers can be miniatures to greater than 70mm. Need warmth to grow well – if growing inside place near NE window about a meter back – if in a greenhouse, temperature range should be between 18 & 27 degrees. Flower spike is set by ensuring the colder temperatures. Repot in spring when pot overfull, cut off old roots, use slow release fertilizer with new mix, add a bit of lime then water in well. When purchasing new plants look for strong healthy leaves and no bugs.
