DRAFT MINUTES OF THE GENERAL MEETING HELD SOLDIERS CLUB; BEACH ROAD BATEMANS BAY

Monday 2nd May 2016

PRESENT: Members: 21 Apologies: 3 Visitors: 1

President Ron opened the meeting thanking all for coming.

Having opened the meeting, Ron welcomed Lanine Harris, Treasurer of the Batemans Bay Hospital Ancillary to receive a cheque for \$250 as a donation from the club. Once presented, Lanine thanked the members for considering the hospital and explained that the ancillary provides the funds to purchase equipment that makes it easier for staff to care for patients and ensures patient comfort and promotes wellness for the patient. Lanine then left the meeting.

It was explained that members of the Moruya Hospital Ancillary and Snowy Hydro Southcare Helicopters had also been invited to the meeting but had been unable to attend. Ron & Margaret have planned to meet with their representatives at the Soldiers Club on Tuesday morning. 2. TREASURER'S REPORT:

Treasurer Anne-Marie Collins presented the April financial report. Opening balance was \$16,544.86. Income from raffle, Grumpy's shed; BBQ and membership totalled \$1,661.20. Expenditure was ink & gifts \$164.97, Tinonee Orchids \$400.00, BBQ expenses \$280.14, computer \$599, Orchid Wiz \$418.34, name badges \$28, and copy paper \$14.15 totalling \$1904.80. There being no questions

Profit from BBQ on 8th April was \$283.44 which will be donated to Snowy Hydro South Care Helicopter as per resolution at the last meeting.

3. GENERAL BUSINESS:

- a. Next General Meeting Speaker will be Lynne Phelan speaking on Laelia-Cattleya family. This is still to be confirmed as Lynne is overseas at present. Ron will follow up with her.
- b. Donation: Kate Willis has given a donation of \$250 to cover the cost of postage of the newsletter for the remainder of the year. Thank you Kate.
- c. Benching: Rob Fish asked about the new form for benching and asked why it was not explained to members prior to its use. It was explained that Brian Coulton had explained it to the committee and had expected to be at this meeting to speak with members prior to voting. However, as explained at the start of the meeting Brian is unwell but had provided the club with the items that he had completed. The main change was to the form itself in that the novice and open sections were separated instead of being on each side of the voting sheet. This had confused members as the novice section is usually where members start the voting because of the layout of the room. The other question was introduction of the two sizes of the Laelijae (under & over 70mm). It was explained that this is now included in the show schedule so it seemed appropriate to put it in the benching. Members were happy with the explanation provided.
- **d. Computer:** Margaret stated that the computer had been purchased and set up. Orchid wiz has not arrived as yet. Ron put

the motion that "a second computer be purchased for the secretary's use". This generated a lot of discussion however after some time it was seconded by Tony Groube on the proviso that both computers were bought to each meeting for members' use. Votes were for 17 against 4. Carried. Margaret to follow up.

- e. Bunnings Family night: time has been brought forward to a 5.30pm start. Ron thanked those members who had offered to attend with him at the last meeting. There was some discussion as to whether or not this is a worthwhile activity. For further discussion once this Family night was over.
- f. Bunnings BBQ: next one is 21st May. Members have volunteered for the morning shift. Members still required for the afternoon shift (12 – 4.30). Please contact Ron if you are able to assist. Date for BBQ in June is Friday 10th. Ron will request assistance for this at the June meeting.
- g. Show Schedule: Ron discussed the changes made to the show schedule. There was no discussion regarding these changes. Moved Ron Boyd; Seconded Matt Janjak. Carried. Margaret will redistribute with next newsletter.
- h. Trophies: Could members who have perpetual trophies for the Winter Show please return them before the July meeting? Thank you.
- i. Orchid Crawl: Due to Brian Coulton's ill health, it is unsure as to whether we will be able to visit his place. Also Tony & Liz's address was wrong in the last minutes – it should be Garagarang St, Maula Bay. Margaret to correct on member lists.
- j. Colour charts: Matt asked if it is still possible to purchase the colour charts used by judges when awarding plants. They were expensive but he is interested in knowing if it is possible to purchase them. Margaret will follow up with the Orchid Council of NSW. (found out that they are 199 pounds plus postage from the Royal Horticultural Society London shop). This started a discussion about judges at shows, the difficulties in getting same, should we request an extra panel

for the Spring show and the requirements of the judges present to find extra judges if the judges felt that a plant was worthy of an award. Those of us who are participating in the Orchid appreciation course explained that Ian Chalmers had made it very clear that two extra judges would be found to be able to award the plant if it was required.
