For those club members who may like to help out but not too sure what goes on, I suggest to make up the numbers at the peak times from 10am to around 2 pm, volunteer for a 2-hour shift either 10am to 12 noon or 12 noon to 2pm. This involves mainly slicing the bread rolls or slices of bread, placing them onto a serviette and onto our special carry board and repeating the order to the cook and then taking the order to where the customer is waiting. ## Workshops

There will be a walk through his Cymbidium house and he will speak about how easy it is to set up a small orchid green house to grow Cymbidiums in. #### Show Date for 2016.

These have been confirmed. See the club program for details. A week prior to these dates, an information display will be put on at the Village Centre. It is hoped that we will be able to have posies for sale and an orchid plant to raffle. to make this successful, However. vour assistance is required. We need members to help make posies as well as supplying the flowers and foliage required to do this. Posey sales are often the biggest money raiser at the shows. We will also require a covered area to do this in.

A suggestion was also made at committee that the club purchase some cymbidium plants for a few members and these plants be used solely for flowers for posies. This is not an unreasonable suggestion but members need to agree and take and look after the plants for this to be successful.

#### In your orchid house:

According to Orchids Australia Magazine Cultural notes for the Sydney area, we should be regularly checking plants for pests and if found, use appropriate control measures. As our weather has been so changeable lately, checking and watering plants is almost a daily requirement. However, it does recommend that if it has been a really hot day to give your plants a drink in the evenings. It also suggests that keeping the floor of the orchid house damp during these days helps the plants keep cooler.

Also in Australian Orchid Council magazine is an article by Dr Noel Grundon FAOC about the effectiveness or otherwise of "blossom boosters". The take home message from this article is that "blossom boosters" are a waste of money as it is not the N:P:K ratio that causes flowering. However, an appropriate fertilizer program can decrease the time a plant can take to first flowering. There are also a range of other factors affecting this, including the genes inherited their from parent plants, temperature variations. of daylight length hours. temperature range and for some species and hybrids a combination of these factors.

#### Benching

Plants benched this year will have the same points system as last year. Members receive 1 point for plant(s) benched in each category. Membership numbers must be recorded on benching card. Points are also given for voting awards  $-1^{st} = 3$  points;  $2^{nd} = 2$  points,  $3^{rd} = 1$  point, plant of the night = 4 points<sup>-</sup> Top points scorer in each category will receive an orchid plant prize at the Christmas party.

## DRAFT MINUTES OF THE SPECIAL MEETING BATEMANS BAY ORCHID & FOLIAGE SOCIETY

Meeting Opened 7.50pm. <u>Minutes of the 2015 AGM</u> had been circulated in the December and January newsletters. Acting Secretary Margaret Turner asked if there were any changes to the minutes as presented. No comments or questions were forthcoming. Acting Secretary moved the motion that they be accepted as read, seconded by Anne-Marie Collins.

The Acting President vacated the chair and the Returning Officer Tony Groube took the chair.

The Returning Officer re-iterated the need for a validly elected committee and read out the role of the committee within an organisation from the Model Constitution. This stated that the committee – manages the organisation, both financially and within the bounds of the constitution. It also represents all members and the members support the committee. He then opened the nomination forms. There were 2 for president; 2 for secretary; 1 vice president; 1 treasurer; 4 committee members includina nominations that had also nominated for executive positions. <u>3.</u> <u>Minutes</u> from previous meeting have been circulated:

<u>4.</u> <u>Secretary's Report:</u> Correspondence in: <u>November:</u> Statement from BioGro, October bank statement, notice of 2EARFM AGM, thank you letter with cheque for postage from prize winner- Regional Show (read out),

<u>December</u>: Magazines – Australian Orchid Review, Orchids Australia, Gardeners Gazette, Orchid News; bank statement for Nov, new cheque book.

January: new membership application, Information about changes to Australia Post, bank statement for December, January Orchid News, mail for Returning Officer, resignation letter from Peter & Annette Stubbs (read out), request for dates of 2016 shows, Milton Show dates, Sapphire Coast newsletter, Eurobodalla Orchid Club newsletter, Bankstown newsletter.

#### Correspondence Out:

Acknowledgement of resignation letter, response to request for judges stating that the dates would be confirmed on 1<sup>st</sup> February & notification would be sent after that.

The Acting Secretary moved the report be accepted, seconded by Rose Boyd Carried

5. <u>Treasurer's Report:</u> November, December & January reports were circulated

The Treasurer went through these reports. Opening balance as at 1<sup>st</sup> November 2015 was \$13,456.55 with a closing balance at 31<sup>st</sup> January 2016 of \$21,009.45.

A question was asked from the floor regarding the return to the club of monies sent to Orchids NSW for plants awarded during the Regional Show. It was explained that monies were collected along with the paperwork prior to being sent to Orchids NSW.

The Acting Treasurer moved that the reports be accepted, seconded by M. Quinlivan. Carried

General meeting suspended at 7.50pm for Special meeting to be conducted.

General meeting resumed with President Ron Boyd in the chair at 8.25pm

- 6. General Business:
  - There are two (2) Bunnings BBQ dates. The President called for volunteers to assist him on these days. The dates being – Friday 12<sup>th</sup> February and Friday 11<sup>th</sup> March. Members nominated themselves. Still looking for some assistance with the afternoon shift – 12md to about 4.30pm for the March date. Morning is from 8am – 12.30pm.

- 2. Ron Boyd discussed the problem of getting members to assist at the BBQs as it seems to always fall to the same small group of people. The carrot approach had been tried with the introduction of the Bunnings vouchers which was suspended last year. Ron suggested that the club consider organising a bus trip to Sydney to see an orchid show. Assistance at the BBQs would enable members to have a discount on the bus trip.
- 3. Ron Boyd then moved a motion that- "the club have a bus trip to Sydney to attend an orchid show". Much discussion followed regarding the pros and cons of this suggestion. These included: - long day (6am -7 or 8pm) which meant about 3 hours at the show; lots to see at a show; could miss out on purchasing plants that you want from a vendor as don't get there until late morning; however, you can ring the vendor to order the plants that you want and they will keep for you. Discussion regarding which show followed. St Ives was rejected, and the possibility of "Orchids Out West" was discussed which is Friday 13<sup>th</sup> May to Sunday 15<sup>th</sup> May. Rob Fish then put forward an alternate suggestion that "instead of hiring a bus members given the opportunity to take their private cars and the club reimburse some of the costs associated with the trip ie for fuel and accommodation. A show of hands of those interested in the bus trip was called for but it was decided that as the suggestion had been put to the members without any prior discussion it was left with the committee to follow up and obtain further information regarding both options. Sylvia Hawkins stated that she felt the members of the Milton/Ulladulla club would be interested in joining in a bus trip. When asked Tony Groube stated last time it had been raised at the Eurobodalla Club, there had not been any interest in doing a trip.
- Discussion regarding time for new committee to meet – decided on 3<sup>rd</sup> Monday of each month at 3.30pm at the Soldiers Club providing a room is available. Ron to follow up with Andrea regarding this and bookings for general meetings and shows for 2016.
- 5. Grumpy's shed income for January was \$474.80. There was discussion relating to members using this service and whether or not Eurobodalla should be sharing in the profits as their members also use the service. In the end it was agreed that as a lot of members have dual membership there was not an issue.

6. This prompted discussion relating to the Not for Profit status the club has when we get a profit from running this service. It was explained that the information provided to the Office of Fair Trading each year included our assets which are Grumpy's Shed, plants, as well as monies in the bank.

#### Coffee Break 9.15pm.

#### Meeting resumed 9.30pm

Public Officer – Margaret Turner was reappointed in that role as this was not done at the Special meeting.

Show dates for 2016 are:- Winter Show  $21^{st}$  July set up and Judging with show being open to the public on Friday  $22^{nd}$  10 -6pm & Saturday  $23^{rd}$  July 10 -3pm. Spring Show dates are to be confirmed. Native Show will be  $20^{th}$  October for set up and judging and open Friday  $21^{st}$  10 – 6pm and Sunday  $22^{nd}$  October from 10 -3pm.

A volunteer was requested to keep supper supplied for the meetings. After discussion Leanda O'Connor agreed to do this role. Thank you Leanda.

There was also discussion regarding Benching & counting points etc. Rob Pollock is to be approached to see if he will do this role again. Brian Coulton offered to assist him to better learn about this process.
