At this session we were introduced to the Masdevallia, Dracula and other Pleurothallids. Ian Chalmers explained how some of the crosses are developed and what each plants picks up from its parent species. Our homework for the month is to choose four (4) different hybrid masdevallias, name the species that has formed the hybrid and identify which of the parents have provided the influence for the plant in its shape, colour and size. An interesting exercise I think.

**MINUTES**: The Minutes of the last General Meeting held on Monday1st March at the Soldiers Club Beach Road, Batemans Bay having been circulated be accepted as a true copy.

#### 1. CORRESPONDENCE:

## 2. TREASURER'S REPORT:

Treasurer Anne-Marie presented financial report. Opening balance was \$21,426.28. Income mainly from club raffle, BBQ and Shed totalled \$1,198.93. Grumpy's Expenditure including BBQ equipment & food \$422.14, restock Grumpy's Shed \$5,046.30, post box renewal \$121.00, camera & SD card \$178.99, plants \$87.12 totalled \$225.00. printer ink \$6080.55 which left a balance \$16,544.66. There were no unpresented cheques. Profit from BBQ on 11/3 was \$301.30.

#### 3. GENERAL BUSINESS:

- a. Next General Meeting is the auction night. Please come with money and items to put on the raffle table. This auction is not just orchids, so anything that you think might sell, please bring along.
- b. Potting demonstration: The club has been invited to put on a potting demonstration at Bunning Family night for Mother's Day on Thursday 5<sup>th</sup> May between 6pm & 8pm. Ron has accepted this offer and asked for assistance on the night. Members Brian Coulton, Brian Perkins, Anne-Marie Collins, Tony Groube & Liz Cleaver offered assistance. Thank you.
- c. Grumpy's shed A robust discussion followed the information that the \$4000 approved at the last meeting had been exceeded. However, after some time a motion was put that "the members note that the previous motion in March meeting was not sufficient to cover purchases and this meeting approves the overall expenditure for stock for Grumpy's Shed." Moved by Tony Groube and seconded by Anne-Marie Collins. An amendment was suggested by Rob Fish but after some more discussion the following was suggested which covered what Rob had been suggesting. "In future all requests for purchases for Grumpy's Shed would have a 25% tolerance to allow for transport and other associated costs." Moved Rob Fish. Seconded: Tony Groube. Carried. Following on from this discussion, Dorothy asked that the motion passed some time ago that allowed her to

- spend up to \$1200 without prior permission be rescinded. Moved by Dorothy Kauffman. Seconded by Ron Boyd carried. Brian Perkins asked if the club had established an asset register which includes the content of Grumpy's Shed. It was explained that Keith and Dorothy keep an up to date list of the items in the Shed. A copy of this spreadsheet is provided president, secretary and treasurer each month. Brian Coulton establishing a spreadsheet for other club property.
- d. Bunning BBQs, next one April 8<sup>th</sup>. Members have volunteered for this. The following one is May 21<sup>st</sup>. Members are asked to think about providing assistance on this day and to let Ron know at the May meeting or before if possible.
- e. Orchid Crawl will be Saturday May 7<sup>th</sup> starting at 10am at Ron Boyd's 14 Gull Place Catalina, followed at 11am at Brian Coulton's at 23 Yarrabee Drive Catalina and finishing at 12noon at Liz & Tony's at 5 Garabarang St Batemans Bay. A BBQ lunch will be provided by Tony & Liz. These members were thanked for offering their homes/orchid homes for discussion and knowledge for other members.
- f. Guest speakers: The list of guest speakers is growing. The list has been updated on the website and the speaker for the following month will be in the newsletter. Any suggestions still welcomed.
- g. Charitable donation: Margaret explained that she has spoken with the presidents of the Ladies Ancillary of both Batemans Bay and Moruya hospitals. Both would welcome a donation. Batemans Bay doesn't hold monies for specific purposes but work towards purchasing something that has been requested. Currently working

towards purchasing a \$15,000.00 machine that helps clean (debrides) wounds and Moruya will be happy to hold onto donated monies if requested for a particular purpose eg. Oncology. Others looked at included Blackdog which seem to be mainly focused in Sydney; Beyond Blue which did not seem to have a local connection and Westpac helicopter which serves four regional areas – Hunter, New England (NW region), Central Coast and Mid-North Coast. Southcare is helicopter service that supports this region. Margaret stated she had not followed up on Southcare. Margaret that the stated committee recommended that the club donate to the local hospitals but had left it to the membership to decide on the amount. After some discussion relating to amount a motion was put "that BBOFS donate \$250.00 to both Batemans Bay hospital and to Oncology unit at Moruya Hospital." Moved by Tony Groube and seconded by Rob Fish. It was then suggested by Rob Fish "that the total profit from the next BBQ on 8<sup>th</sup> April be donated to Southcare helicopters". This was supported unanimously.

h. Computer purchase: Margaret had investigated options. There were three (3) that would suit the club's needs. There are Acer Aspire 15.6 notebook with 4GB RAM & 1TB hard drive, an ASUS 15" also with 4GB RAM & 1TB hard drive both at \$598.00 and a Hewlett Packard 15" with 8GB RAM and a 1TB hard drive for \$689.00. After some discussion it was decided that we would purchase the Acer Aspire and would also add a wireless keyboard and mouse and a bag to the value of \$700.00. The purchase of Orchid Wiz was also approved by members after being moved by Tony Groube and seconded by Robert Fish.

i. Matt then stated that while all this was good for the club, we are about growing and showing orchids and as such should ensure that members know how to grow and name their orchids and should also know what to look for when purchasing orchids. Ron explained that a couple of the guest speakers will assist with that. It was also suggested that we ask Brian Phelan to be a guest speaker at some point.

9 pm Coffee Break 9.15 pm Return

After the coffee break, Ron invited Tony & Liz to speak about "managing their orchid collection"

Tony started off by telling us that on January 1<sup>st</sup> 2016, he & Liz had 3169 orchid plants & then Liz started repotting on January 2<sup>nd</sup> so now he is not too sure how many they have. He also mentioned that they are trying to "downsize" which raised a laugh as they have been trying, unsuccessfully, to do that for some time. They have plants on east side of their home so plants get morning and midday sun only but not early morning sun as canopy and hedge protect them from this. They try to keep the same genera this helps together as with maintenance like watering, fertilizing and repotting and identifying spikes when starting to flower. They hand water all pots using the M-GAMP system. This helps them look at each plant individually which assists with monitoring health of the orchids and means that things can be dealt with then and there. Most plants are undercover which assists with water control. As the plants are crowded together, pests are not easy to see so regular pest protection is a must. They also stressed the need to look at your plants by torchlight at night. Tony also said that he sprays "surface spray" over the top of spikes and flowering plants but never at them. When repotting, sterilize tools between each plant. They use 100% liquid sugar soap to soak tools in which is changed as needed. Ray Clement suggests a 50/50 mix. When repotting, they try to match bark size to pot size - mostly medium (12-18) Orchiata bark (just started using this and hope to reduce root rot) and large bark for Sarcs. Each time an orchid is repotted it is dusted with a 50/50 mixture of blood and bone and dolomite. All pots get this mixture in spring. Repotting is also a good time to check all plants for mealy bug and give them a spray with metho and follow up with eco oil for good measure. This can also be done if spotted when watering or checking plants. Dip divisions in potassium permanganate (or spray depending on the weather) and dust after any "pruning" with sulphur during maintenance attention spike or removal. They also stated that disease control starts with the purchase of plants. Choose recognized vendors and inspect plants well. To avoid losing plants repot into your own mix as soon as possible. With name tags for plants, use an ordinary HB pencil to write with and add date of purchase or when repotted.
