Notes from our Secretary Ron Boyd

Thanks to all the members who bought in their "Experience in Growing Cymbidium" plant Cymbidium Australian Ginger 'Bronzy' X Pywacket 'Cornflakes'

Just to add to some of the answers asked, I fertilize my Cymbidiums about every 2 to 3 weeks with Epsom Salts, (Magnesium sulfate (or magnesium sulphate) is an <u>inorganic salt (chemical compound</u>) containing <u>magnesium</u>, <u>sulphur</u> and <u>oxygen</u>, with the formula MgSO)

Mixed ½ to 1 level small teaspoon to about 5 lt. of water and sprinkle over the tops of the Cymbidium plants leaves, works quickly greening up the leaves, making a stronger healthy plant. (Available cheap from Harrison Rural supplies Moruya.)

Scott's Special Slow realise fertilizer (From Grumpys shed)

I fertilize October long weekend, New Year's Day and St Patrick's Day (17th March) each year, I use about ³/₄ of a spoonful per 8 inch pot!

I usually lime over the top of the potting mix with about 1 spoonful per 8 inch pot, each October long weekend only & water in, this keeps the potting mix sweet and Ph. up.

Some members asked the question, could they add a water soluble fertilizer as an extra boost; I do not do it, mainly as I think my slow release does a good job and perhaps I am a bit lazy to do the extra work on a lot of plants! Hey, but this is what this Growing Experience is all about, try out new ideas and better ways to grow you cymbidium.

I add an activator to my plants potting mix about every 3 weeks or so, this help the microbes, good bacteria etc. in the potting mix break down the chemical fertilizers to make it more easy available to the plants roots system, I use GoGo juice made by Neutrog, available at Bunnings. You can also use Sea weed based fertilizer, Charlie Carp, Dynamic lifter or any organic based fertilizer.
