Jean Swindley spoke on Dockrillia and Gordon Marion entertained us with his take on growing **Cattleyas**. They were both excellent. I know those who were there were very impressed with their talks and the orchids they brought for us to look at. The white cattleya was stunning. At our October meeting, we are very lucky to have Jeanne Dunn, very well-known orchid grower from Victoria. She will be talking on Sarcochilus intergeneric breeding, plus she will have some plants for sale.

Our **workshop, at Bunnings,** on Thursday, the 29TH August, went very well. Our members were very active and we had an enjoyable time. Our Spring Show was well publicised, plus we received a voucher, for our efforts.

2. TREASURER'S REPORT:

- Treasurer Leanda presented:- Opening balance \$8,952.04; Income \$67.71 Expenditure \$700.00; no unpresented cheques; closing balance \$8319.75 plus term deposit, floats and vouchers.

- **GUEST SPEAKERS:** Jean Swindley: 3. spoke about her ongoing passion for Dockrillias. She stated that they are not difficult to grow. They require some humidity, prefer to be mounted and of course water and fertilizer. When the plants are mounted, regular watering and fertilizing are required. The fertilizer should be very weak, about 1/4 strength, but use often. Jean spoke about the different mounts she has used for these plants. They include hardwood fence pailings, tree fern and pine bark that all work very well. However, cork and treated pine the plants do not do as well on. Jean said that she has deflasked some Docks and has had flowers of different colours from the same flask, so they are not always what you expect. When asked if she deflasks straight onto mounts, she stated it depended on the size of the plant. If only small will use a compots with spag moss until plants more established. She gets her flasks mainly from DUNO and Jeannie Dunn.
- Gordon Marion spoke about cattleyas. When dividing these plants need to leave about four (4) canes. Repotting should be done when new growth is seen on the plants. These plants like some humidity, big bark. Don't let these plants get over grown as they become very unruly which make them very hard to control. If the bulbs are starting to rot, they have had too much water or need more humidity. These plants can be

revived if you have a hot house. If not, place plant in a plastic bag with spag moss until new roots appear then repot. Gordon uses a hydroponic mix of equal parts of jumbo perlite, granulated grow wool and chopped up food grade polystyrene. Remember to try different things if plants are not growing well. He also told us that if you want to grow a cattleya as a specimen plant, to get one that clumps.
