DRAFT MINUTES OF THE GENERAL MEETING HELD SOLDIERS CLUB; BEACH ROAD, BATEMANS BAY

Monday 5<sup>th</sup> September 2016

PRESENT: Members: 24 Apologies: 1

Visitors: 2

President Ron opened the meeting thanking all for coming and invited David Glynn to speak to members about his orchids and the nursery he runs.

David used a PowerPoint presentation to show some of the parent plants he uses for breeding in particular from Canaliculatum. David stated that he used very little water in winter (spray only), but reminded members that his winter up near Bowral is very different to ours on the coast. He showed us plants that were the same hybrid but because they were placed in different light they were different colours. He also showed Suave hybrids and commented that the Suave distribution was from Eden to Townsville.

Growing culture: for natives & hybrids David uses the following potting mix – 40% course bark (12 – 18) 40% coconut chip (12-16) and 20% large perlite.

Light: for Canaliculatum and hybrids uses 30% shade under a polycarbonate cover which lets in the UV light uninterrupted and he hangs these plants high in the greenhouse. For Madolium, Suave and hybrids he uses 50% shade.

Water: very little in winter and the usual in summer – as plants need it.

Fertilizer: NKP uses 6:18:36 – high in phosphate and potassium and adds osmocote. He did however clarify that there is one orchid that does not like nitrogen and that is Black Beauty. He runs this plant with a PH of about 5.5.

Repotting: when finishes flowering or when he takes flower spikes off.

Throughout the presentation David showed multiple photos of his plants that he has bred and grown.

Ron thanked David for his interesting and informative presentation and presented him with a small gift from the club.

Anne-Marie also spoke of the search for an auditor for the club's financial statements. She explained that Belinda Shalders from Batehaven Nursery and Hardware is an Accountant and moved a motion "that she approach Belinda and ask her to audit the books for 2016" Moved Anne- Marie Collins. There was a short discussion as to the cost of this but Anne-Marie explained that Belinda had stated that there would either be no cost or a minimal cost depending on the involved. amount of work seconded by Robert Fish and carried on show of hands.

Seconded by Anne-Marie Collins passed on show of hands.
