In your orchid house.

Spring is not that far away (not that our weather is allowing us to think that now). We need to start thinking about watering plants more regularly, particularly with this wind as it can be very drying. With the increased watering, the need to fertilize increases, so look at what your plants need at this time. Pest control is important at this time of year with the changing climate and new growths and spikes appearing. When checking plants for scale and mealy bug, make sure you check your spike sheaths as well. Some cymbidiums may be ready to repot if flowering has finished. Seedlings may also be ready to pot on.



2. TREASURER'S REPORT:

3. GENERAL BUSINESS:

- **a. Next General Meeting:** Steve Morgan bromeliads.
- b. Ron informed the membership of the death of long time member Norm Kemp. His funeral will be at Broulee Memorial Gardens on Wednesday 8th August, Ron will be attending to represent the club. Other members are welcome to attend.
- c. Lin had offered her apologies as she is overseas attending her daughter's wedding.
- d. Bus trip planned for Friday 17th. It was suggested that the Garden Club be offered the opportunity to attend to fill some of the empty seats. Min had emailed Ron saying the she will be unable to assist with the raffle on the bus. Una offered to help. Thanks Una.
- e. Spring Show is not far away. Looking for helpers again please. Also need flowers and foliage for posies. Please contact Leanda. Sponsorship is also still available.
- f. Banners still to be collected from Dot and Karen at Mogo. Ron to follow up. As we cannot use Coast and Country to hang signs, Leanda offered to speak to the Vet again.
- **g.** Ron requested his mobile number be added to the newsletter due to ongoing issues with his landline.
- **h.** Ron then presented a slide show on viruses. It was from Taiwan and was involved and technical, however it did give an overview of what the most common viruses look like and some suggested treatment. Tony/Ron had brought in some leaves that were marked which could be considered suspect for members to see. They were in a sealed plastic bag. Ron handed out a pamphlet produced by the Australian Orchid Council, which has good basic information on it. (I

will try to copy for newsletter). Ron recommended that plants are treated with Epson salts about every 2 weeks between Spring and Autumn to help control viruses at a rate of a tablespoon per 10L and spray over the top of the leaves. However be sure not to mix with other fertilizers. Sometimes the viruses manifest themselves in colour breaks in the flowers particularly odents, oncids and Phaphs. Tony made the comment that the plants benched at the Winter show were very clean.
