5. TREASURER'S REPORT:

Treasurer Leanda presented: Opening balance \$8,723.22; Income \$894.19; Expenditure \$1,730.46 (includes Native Show); Unpresented cheques \$64.00; current balance \$7,886.95. Moved: Leanda O'Connor Seconded: Tony Groube Carried

A Native show reconciliation was also presented, which indicated that the show made a loss of \$231.74.

6. A.G.M.

commenced at 7.39 p.m. and was completed at 8.02 p.m.

7. GENERAL BUSINESS:

- a. Next General Meeting and Christmas Party: 2nd December
- b. Native Show: we had a financial loss, as previously presented. We need more plants on the sales table and more posies. The 2018 Native show profit was a fluke. Native shows might never make a profit. Because of the increase in prize money (to go back to the way that it was), we could well make a loss of \$900 next year. There was probably a record number of plants displayed by two member couples. Maybe we could utilise succulents in the next posies. We are holding the Native Show on the Saturday and Sunday next year, so we might not be able to compare results.
- **c.** Sunday 10th November is the date of our next Bunnings B.B.Q. Anne-Marie asked for more helpers. Rob Fish offered to help in the lunchtime period from 11.30 a.m. to 1.30 p.m.
- **d.** Those attending our Christmas party function, need to pay by 20th November please, so that Anne-Marie can inform

the SteamPacket Hotel of our numbers. It can be paid after 20th by electronic transfer. Desserts need to be decided upon and advised to Anne-Marie. She will contact those going, to obtain their dessert selection. There will be a 'secret Santa' present (\$5.00 max.) non-gender specific.

- e. It was suggested (by Peter Cordina) that at our show, we have a 'visitor choice' of selected plant. Canberra has had this for many years, said Tony Groube. How to do it? Maybe give entrants a ticket to place in front of their plant of choice. Or on their lucky door ticket, maybe they could also list their postcode and where they heard of the event. Perhaps the person on the door could have a clipboard and record these. Brian Perkins stated that the person on the door is too busy to do this, when several people come in the door at once, as they most often do. Maybe a floor walker could go around the show display and ask people this information.
- f. Motion for reduction in fees was presented by Ron Boyd. Members -Single rate now to be \$10 (previously \$15); 'Dual / Couple' to be \$15 (previously - was listed as being 'Family' \$20); Junior (under 16) to be \$5; postage (not email) of newsletters to be \$5 p.a. (previously nil).

Passed: Unopposed by members, however with 3 abstentions

(Anne-Marie Collins said that our loss might be \$200 but don't hold me to it).

g. Potential bus trip to an orchid show next year. This Society has made a loss on these in recent years. Not enough of our local members are going. Quite a

bit of discussion ensued. Rob and Sue Fish said that they would not go - you are 10 hours (back and forth) on a bus for only being 2 hours at a show. We would always arrive after the sales table had been ravaged. Ron Boyd said that he would go again but in personal transport. Tony Groube agreed that he would only go to shows in personal transport. Should we have a bus trip at all. Bus must be full and we might even then make a loss. There was a suggestion that 'a bus seat' could even be a raffle prize at next year's general meetings. Possibility of taking turns, with other societies, to run the bus trips. As President of the EOC, Tony Groube said no.

- h. Supper break at 8.39 p.m. to 8.55 p.m.
- i. Ron Boyd requested that we move the Native Show, one week later in the year, as there were not many sarcs in flower this year. Maybe to be on October 31st or November 1st. Anne-Marie said that this would have to be investigated with the Soldiers' Club, first. Leave it as it is next year and see what happens, as the climate varies from year to year. In 2021 there are 5 weekends in October. Ron Boyd moved a motion that in 2021, we move the date of the Native Show to the 4th weekend in October.
