# 3. GENERAL BUSINESS:

a. Bus trip in 2022 Ron discussed suggestion that the club run a bus to one of the big orchid shows in Sydney as there would be a variety of vendors and a larger variety of plants on display. The trip to Sharkies in Cronulla would be a 31/2 to 4 hour drive. Anne-Marie had asked both Rixons and Marshalls for a quote on cost of bus hire for the trip. Bus to be 48 seats with a toilet. Rixons had not responded to this time. Marshalls have guoted \$1500 + GST of \$150 which makes the cost all up of \$1650. If all seats were taken, it would be a cost of \$35 a seat. Ron suggested that the other clubs close to us – EOC and MUOS members could be asked to join us. Robert Fish suggested that if the bus was not filled which was likely, it would be a expensive exercise for

BBOFS. Robert felt there is better ways to spend money for members. To be discussed further in the New Year.
