In your Orchid House

Not too sure how long this dry spell will last, but it does mean that the hose has been out again. Most species currently don't require much water, so once or twice a week should be sufficient, however, you need to check what your plants need rather than rely on general information. More damage is done to plants that are cold and wet rather than cold and dry.

Pest spot checks will still be required, so some eco-oil on hand will be helpful. There maybe a few snails around as well so some pellets may be helpful to keep these off your spikes and new growths on the plants. Most plants still require a weak solution of fertilizer, so weekly weakly applies during these colder months.

3. GENERAL BUSINESS:

- a. Next General Meeting; Kylie Stocks Tassel Ferns
- b. Bunnings BBQ Sunday July 3rd. helpers please have but need 4 more (3 morning & 1 afternoon) members offered their assistance and we now have full quota for both shifts. Thank you everyone.
- c. Monetary gift to Judges currently \$80.00. The letter that came with the judge's names suggested that we look at the remuneration given to the judges because of the increased costs associated with travelling. After some discussion Anne-Marie put the motion that "the Judges remuneration for shows be increased to \$100 for twelve (12) months with the plan to then review it" Seconded by Robert Fish. A vote was called 10 agreed; no against and 3 abstained.
- d. Leanda reminded members that we would need some cymbidium spikes for Posey making just prior to the show.
- e. Anne-Marie told members of the passing of Annette Stubbs. Annette and her husband Peter were members of BBOFS several years ago and had a long history of orchid growing. Peter is a judge and well known in the orchid world. We have sent a card to Peter from the Club. Her funeral is this Wednesday (8th June).
- f. Anne-Marie reminded members that helpers would be required at the set up for the show as well as during the open to public times

- (Saturday 10 5 and Sunday 10 3). She also asked members to think about sponsoring some of the championships most are \$10.00. Robert reminded members not to judge their own plants, but if they are unsure about a plant to bring it in and speak to the Show Marshall about it.
- g. Ron will do the Novice Corner next meeting. He will discuss Nomenclature and carnivorous plants.

4. Guest Speaker – Garry Evans excellent Cymbid grower

Garry has been growing cymbidiums for about 15 years and has had excellent results from the methods he has perfected during that time. He brought a couple of his plants into show us just how well he grows them. Unfortunately, he is moving down into the Gippsland area and will be growing mostly other types of orchids that grow in a warmer hot house. Garry's current orchid house is 20m X 4m which faces north for better air flow and is covered with 70% shade cloth. He hangs some of the plants, however, those on benches are on reo which allows good drainage.

The mix he uses allows free flowing of water thru it. His mix is equal parts of coco peat, bark and perlite. He repots regularly, but doesn't very often divide the plants as he prefers to grow them into specimen sized plants.

He usually fertilizes weakly about every two (2) weeks. He varies what he uses but his main choice is Campbell's water soluable solution of NPK Diamond Special T. To encourage flowering he uses Calcium Nitrate Prill. These is available thru Bishops. Dissolve 1 teaspoon in hot water then add that to a 9lites watering can and sprinkle all over the plant.

When repotting, Garry always uses a plant starter, which helps the plant re-establish in the pot. This he varies also with Go Go Juice. He uses Eco – oil as a surface spray when required and he reminded us not to expose the plant to sunlight immediately after use. He will also mix this with detergent and or Seasol when required. He also uses Confidor for pesticide control both to treat outbreaks and as a maintenance management.

As his shade house has reo over the roof, he uses yo yo to support spikes and to encourage them to grow upright.

Ann-Marie thanked Garry for an interesting and informative talk.
