#### In Your Orchid House

Autumn is a glorious time of year; however, we need to keep a close eye on our plants to monitor their water needs in particular. Most don't need fertilizer over winter, but some do require small amounts. Sarcs are one group that require constant water and fertilizer throughout the year. Pests may also be about in the cooler weather. Treat them as needed. I have noticed that I rarely get any pests on my sarcs and not sure if that is luck or the pests don't like the sarcs. Flowers and spikes will be on most cymbids at this time of year. For best display of the flowers, encourage the spikes straight up. There are a number of ways to do this and Gordon showed us and discussed a few options at out May meeting (see minutes).

#### 2. TREASURER'S REPORT:

#### **GUEST SPEAKER – Gordon Marion**

Gordon spoke about managing spikes for show and bench presentation. Cymbid spikes should be supported so that they remain upright unless it is an arching or descending type, although it is possible to encourage these spikes to be upright as well. All cymbids are easier to transport if the spikes are upright. If you have a plant that has never flowered for you before, let it do its own thing for the first year, then decide how you want to manage it in future.

You can support a flower spike by using a yo-yo or fishing line, just be careful that it isn't too tight, but firm enough to support and encourage the spike to grow upright. If you need to support an early spike into an upright position, do it slowly and gently and in the warmest part of the day.

If you have leaves on the plant that are starting to yellow, peel them off early as they are easier to get off then.

Cattleya's - Gordon uses his own hypoponic mix as Cattleya love humidity and don't like having wet feet. He repotted a plant to show us how he does this. Best to have three (3) bulbs as he has found that they flower better that way. Gordon made a tepee of small stakes to support the plant after repotting, to hold the plant solidly until it settles into its new pot and re-establish a good root hold. Gordon suggested that if using bark, a complete fertilizer needs to be used, using the old adage - use weakly whenever you water making sure that you flush pots every so often to remove build-up of fertilizer in pot.

Gordon very kindly put the three (3) new plants on the raffle table, as well as providing another plant that he brought in for that purpose.

Those of us who were the winners of the plants appreciate it. Thank you Gordon.

After some discussion, it was decided that we would move the dates forward a weekend, thus the new dates for the Spring Show are 27, 28 & 29 August. We spoke about running a raffle to help offset the costs associated with the show and the management of the club are fine with that. This will be especially helpful as the prize monies return to pre - 2018 levels this year. The committee will organise the usual ribbons and small trophies for the shows. However, we do need everyone to start talking about when the shows will be on and encourage members of the public to attend. It was suggested that we inform all the independent living areas and low care nursing homes early so that they can plan a trip into the activity calendar.
