In your Orchid House

We continue to have this crazy weather. I have lots of new growths on plants, so we need to make sure they are having enough water and fertilizer to keep them growing properly. In my early days of orchid growing I was told that plants should be fertilized three times a year with a slow release the last being fertilizer. around Valentine's day, then allowed to rest going into the winter months, before starting again in spring. However, the caveat on that was that some plants continue to need some liquid fertilizer throughout the colder months. So whatever the plants need is what we should be doing for them and of course following what you would normally do. Most growers have their own system that they follow and should continue to do that.

With the changing weather, scale can be a problem, so make sure that you are checking plants leaves and down into the bulbs, to make sure nothing is hiding. When cleaning up the dried sheaths is a good time to be doing this. If your orchid house is crowded, remove the affected plant and check those around it as the scale can spread rapidly. When cleaning and checking your plants, don't forget to check your mounts. Sometimes, they may need the natural mount material replaced. It is often difficult to do that with a wellestablished plant, so just add another mount to the one already there and hopefully the roots will find their way to the new one.

3. GENERAL BUSINESS:

- a. Next General Meeting; Bric a Brac auction – anything that you want to get rid of
- b. Calendar Update: some dates getting locked in, however now have a couple of more speakers so will see where the dates fit with them
- c. Bunnings BBQ's: need to decide if we are going to do these this year. We meet some of the requirements under the new guidelines, however, Margaret no longer able to do the work required to organise, purchase and carry the required Members equipment. asked whether or not they felt someone could take over that role. No one offered. So discussion continued regarding the feasibility of doing them. It was decided to withdraw from them for this twelve (12) months (2023) and review again at the AGM in November. Margaret to notify the new Activity Officer at Bunnings.

4. Guest Speaker: Sue Carrol – miniature orchids.

Sue explained that she started growing orchids after her brother gave her some Masdevallias' and how that interest developed into the small orchids because of lack of room. She had a slide show of some of the small orchids that she has grown — some successfully, other not so, but she continues to grow these orchids with really tiny flowers.

They need lots of care when grown like this. All her tiny orchids are grown in moss, which she changes annually. She waters them by hand using a sprayer every day, particularly the mounts. Her orchid house has open weave so that it has a good air flow around the plants.

When mounting plants, she puts the plant directly onto the mount, usually a natural mount, then puts the moss over the roots and then wraps with fishing line. They remain horizontal for at least six weeks prior to hanging.

Fungus can be a particular problem on some of them and the grower needs to be careful when checking plants to ensure they remain free from pests and diseases.
